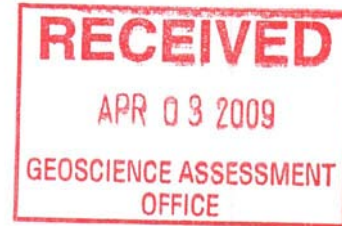

## Report for Prospecting Work on Claim #3017340

### Location and Access

Claim #3017340 is located in Cleaver Township and is accessible by logging road from South Porcupine. Refer to Maps 1&2 Access by foot to the northern part of Claim #3017340 is had from the main road at the location of post #4. Access to the southern part of Claim #3017340 is had from the main road down a skidder road.

### Log of Prospecting

October 3 2008

9:30 to 15:30

Traveled to claims by pickup truck to Claim #3017340 Via Logging road and parked at post #4. Walked to location A through heavy bush and located old trench work along side of lake. Proceeded to cleared trench of forest debris and overburden and a 10kg grab sample taken. The Trench is about 15m long and runs in an easterly direction down to the lake. A vein of heavy mineralisation is exposed here. The weathered mineralised rock is tan in colour and very heavy with quartz crystals imbedded in it. When freshly broken the mineralised rock is a lead gray colour with flat cleavages which are shiny. The bed rock around the mineralisation is rusted and hard. A transverse south along Lake I to Lake II was made to location B where the bed rock is exposed and is banded and very hard with some mineralization and quartz stringers. A sample of the bedrock was taken at location D.

15:30 to 16:30

Returned to South Porcupine.

October 4 2008

8:00 to 9:00

Traveled to claims by pickup truck to Claim #3017340 Via Logging road and parked at post #4.

9:00 to 15:00

Walked to location A and then south along Lake I to Lake II. Crossed the two small streams flowing into Lake II and travelled along lake to Location C where another old trench is located. There is about 1m of overburden here. The trench was cleared of forest debris and overburden. The vein of mineralization in this trench is very similar to that in location A and is exposed for about 20m and also runs in an east-west direction.

The western portion end in a low lying area and the easter portion ends in overburden and trees. A 10kg grab sample was taken. A transverse along the eastern side of Lake II was made to the the river that drains out and cannot be crossed. The bed rock along the lake is similar to the rock at location B and is very hard.

15:00 to 16:00

Returned to South Porcupine.

October 15 2008

7:30 to 8:30

Traveled to claims by pickup truck to Claim #3017340 Via Logging road and parked at a location G.

8:30 to 15:30

Walked north to the southern shore of Lake II and then east to location E. There is indication of previous work done along the lake. A 2 kg sample of the rock at location F was taken. The rock is very rusty and altered with sulphide mineralization. Traveled west along lake II to location E were there is a small pit roughly 2m in diameter. The rock is very rusty, banded with sulphides. A 5kg sample was taken.

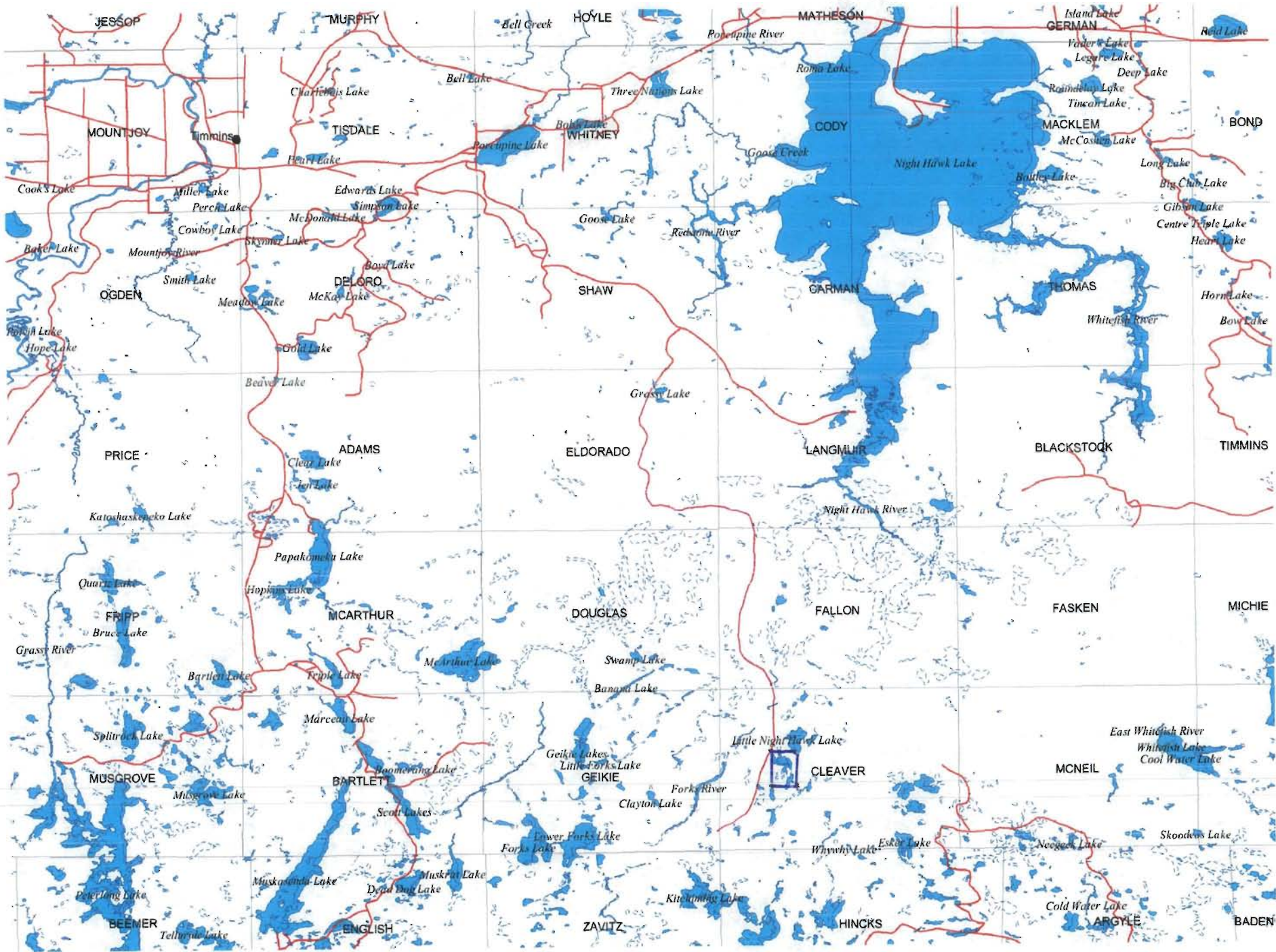

# Location Map A



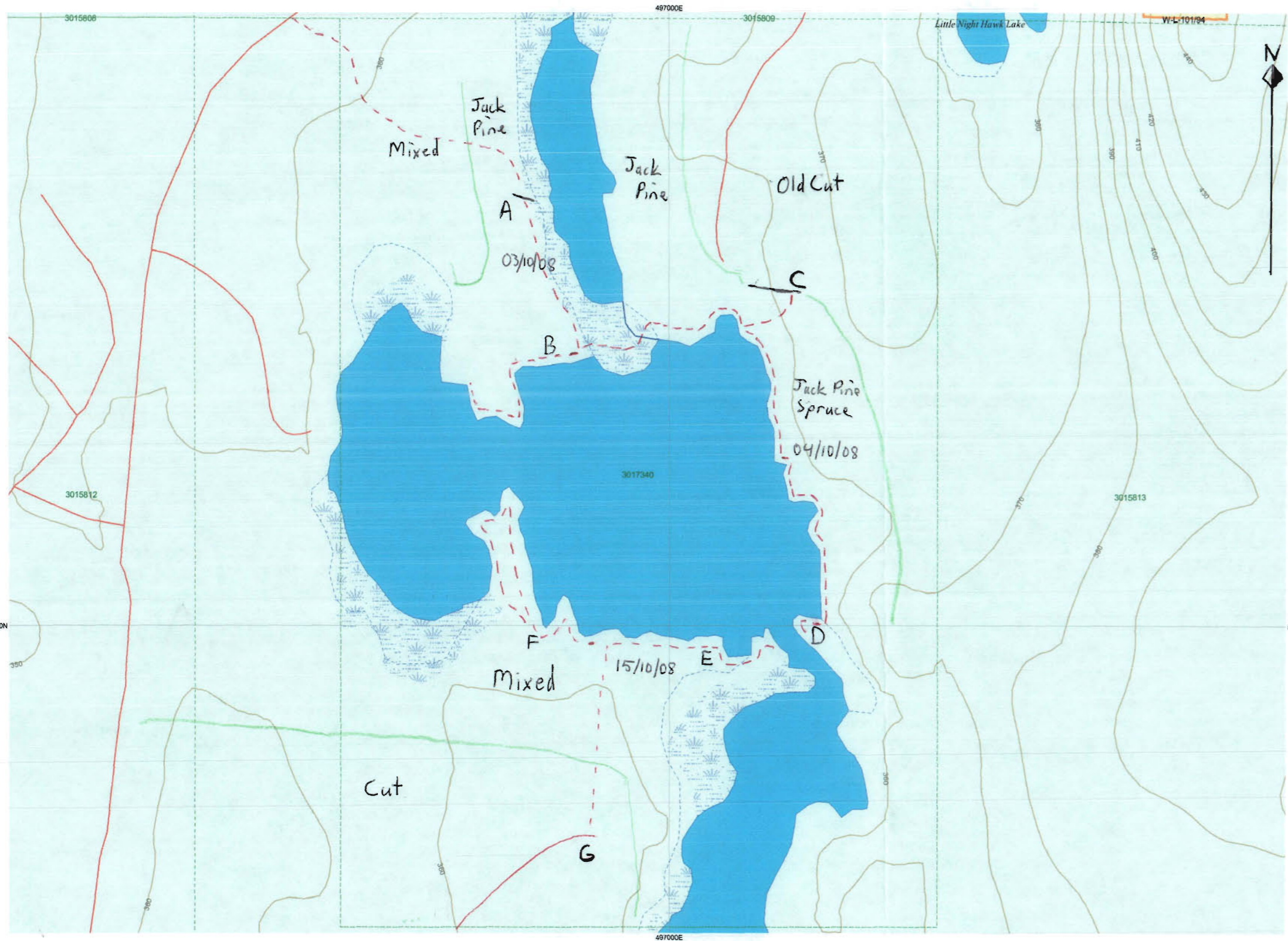

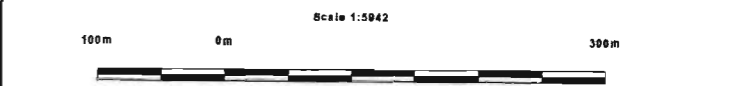
