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
INTRODUCTION


A soil geochemical survey was conducted between August 1 to August 11, 1984 on the Kenogaming Township property, for Glen Auden Resources Ltd. The property consists of forty-three contiguous unpatented mining claims, located in the north central part of Kenogaming Township, District of Sudbury (Figures 1 and 2). The property consists of claims S683103 to S683145, inclusive.

It is the purpose of this report to discuss the findings of the soil geochemical survey.

LOCATION AND ACCESS

The Glen Auden Resources claim group is located in the north central portion of Kenogaming Township, District of Sudbury, The property is approximately 40 miles southwest of Ontario. Ontario and approximately 20 miles east of the town of Timmins, Folevet, Ontario. The property is accessible by the Kenogaming Limited all-weather gravel road which branches off Logging Highway 101 about 10 miles west of Joe's Halfway House on the Opishing River. The property is about 2 miles east of the east fork in the Kenogaming Logging Road which is about 5 miles south of Highway 101.





DISCUSSION OF SOIL GROCHEMICAL SURVEY

A soil geochemical survey was carried out from August 1 to August 11, 1984, over 17 of the 43 claims on the Kenogaming Township property to delineate any possible areas of mineralization over the eastern half of the property. A total of 729 soil samples were taken every 100 feet. The following claims were covered by the survey: P-683127 - 683143.

INTERPRETATION OF SOIL SURVEY

Of the 729 soil samples taken, only three returned weakly elevated gold values up to 10ppb. The remainder of the samples returned between 2ppb - 6ppb gold. The weakly anomalous gold values occur in the southeast corner of the property between 20+00E to 28+00E south of 30+00S Tie Line. A series of trenches with pyritic sericitic schist occurs here.

CONCLUSIONS

Only one area on the Kenogaming Township property returned weakly elevated gold values. This area is known to contain a pyritic sericitic schist.
