LOCATION AND ACCESS

Aylmer Township is located north of Lake Wanapitei, Sudbury Mining Division. Access to the mining claims in Aylmer Township is via Highway 545 North of Capreol and onto the Portelance Road. You travel north for 18 km after the turnoff for the Wanapitei First Nation. You then leave the Portelance Road and turn south over the bridge of the Wanapitei River onto the Poupore Road. You travel south on the Poupore Road for 11 km to 13 km to the gravel pit on the edge of the east branch of the Wanapitei River. You turn south towards lake Wanapitei on the North River Park Road for 2 km to the middle of the claim.





Job: Aylmer

Date: November 2, 2015

Picked up Jim in Falconbridge and Tom in Capreol and travelled up to work on claim 4219156 in the middle to the bottom of the western portion of the claim. The terrain is very rough with mixed forest, but is currently being logged by Gervais Lumber. The rock type was entirely grey wacke with the jointing running close to North South. We returned through the central part of the claim back to the water falls.

Date: November 15, 2015

Picked up Jim in Falconbridge and Tom in Capreol and travelled to work on claim 4219156. Gervais has piled wood on both sides of the access road making it difficult. We travelled south from the water falls parking site through the grow op. This area has been strip cut. The exposed rock is flat lying to -20 degrees' grey wacke. We then returned a wooded area (Jack Pine) still in grey wacke and then walked out of the claim that has been strip cut and is sand and gravel.

Date: May 14, 2016

Picked up Jim in Falconbridge and travelled up to work on claim 4219156. Gervais Lumber appears to have completed the stripping of all the Jack Pine, Birch and Popular. We did a more detailed mapping in the area of the water falls. This fine grained material is very blotchy blocky from vertical fractures running North 10 degrees East and flat fractures to -10 degrees. We took pictures to illustrate the structure with this rock being so homogeneous. Maybe it has a potential as building stone.

Preamble

We have now prospected the exposed rock on the bottom of claim 4219156 and it is all grey wacke and mudstone. The strike is nearly all N/S with deviations of + or -10 degrees. The dip is either vertical and or -20 degrees through all the exposed area. We took pictures as the structure is so unique.
