

Sapawe – Line Re-Establishing

Job Description – Haveman Brothers was hired by Pierre Gagne to re-establish all old claims lines on claims 4222971 and 4272750. Both claim boundaries were in need of attention as brush had covered most signs of old line and made them difficult to follow. Claims in areas and bush such as this should be re-established often as they grow in much faster than average. Mike Haveman and Ted Gilverson were the prospectors responsible for carrying out the work as requested.

Access – Claims were accessed by atv using a trail running off Pipeline Rd. which runs out of Sapawe. A kayak was used to cross the lake and reach the lines connecting the number 1 post and witness posts on the island.

Rates – There was approximately 10km of line including water. Rate per Km was set at \$680 and covered wages, food, lodging, equipment, fuel, kayak, atv, and truck.

Dates – Completing this job took 2 days of work in the field with 2 personnel, and a few hours of office work. Job started on June 3, 2015 and final report was submitted on June 6, 2015.

Work – Work started June 3, 2015, the crew drove to the site and proceeded work on the north end. All lines accessed by boat were completed as well as west boundary of 4222971. The old lines on 4222971 were very difficult to follow mostly because of thick bush. June 4 the crew went back to finish the project and completed 4272750 and the south and east part of 4222971. Again the bush was very thick, alder had taken over the area with thick cedar on the east side. Lines were cut and blazed making them very visible and easy to walk. Lines on 4272750 were hidden quite well by the ever-growing underbrush, making blazes and flag difficult to follow. Tying on and locating these claims has become much easier due to the work completed. Office work was completed June 6, 2015.

Reasoning for Claim 4272750 Line Refurbish - Northern Ontario is known to have some of the most consistently thick and wild bush in Canada. This being said it is common to come across claims less than 3 years old that area difficult to locate. Thick alder and cedar have especially dominated the area in and around claim 4272750. With little to blaze and lots to clear it is a very difficult claim to stake well, combine that with the rapid growth rate of alder and poplar, the blazes and other markings get covered up and lost in the mess.

Daily Log:

June 3, 2015

- Left HBFS shop at 8 am and drove to Sapawe.
- Proceeded to find access into claim, initial idea was to quad down pipeline.
- Pipeline went through a large unpassable swamp and quad got stuck.

- Set-up camp after work and maintained equipment.

Ted Gilverson

- Kayaked to and re-furbished the lines on the north end of the claim block between post 1 and post 4 of 4222971.
- Quad down to southwest corner of claim 4222971 and started heading north off the trail/pipeline.
- Refurbished the line up until meeting with Mike around post 3 of 4222971 at 6:30 pm.

Mike Haveman

- Located line about 550m south of corner 1 on 4222971.
- Refurbished line heading south then east when directional post was located.
- Cut around patent FF4094 and headed south toward post 3 of 4222971.
- Met with Ted around post 3.
- Headed out of the bush to make camp.

June 4, 2015

- Left for work at 8:30 am and quad to claim block.
- Packed up camp and left site back to HBFS shop.
- Arrived at shop around 6:30 pm.

Ted Gilverson

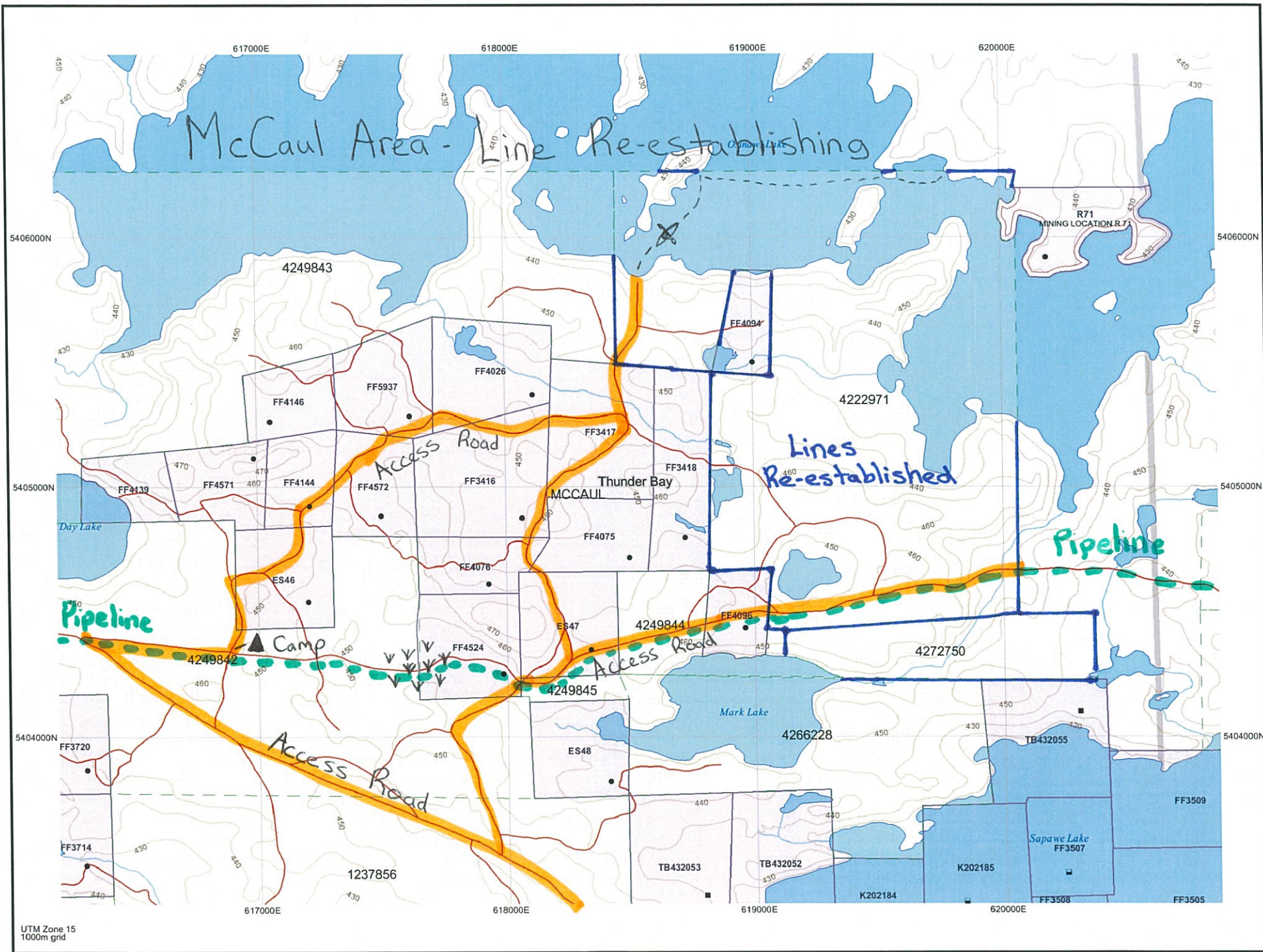
- Started south off trail/pipeline to post 2 of claim 4222971 and re-furbished line heading east on claim 4272750.
- Went east to post 1, south to post 2, west to post 3, and north to post 4.
- Hit post 4 at about 3:30 pm

Mike Haveman

- Left for work with Ted to claim block.
- Started refurbishing line at southwest corner of claim 4222971 heading south off the trail/pipeline.
- Located the directional post and headed East on the south line towards post 2.
- Post 2 found then proceeded north towards post 1.
- Finished around 3 and walked out meeting Ted on the trail.
- Headed out of the bush back to camp.

June 6, 2015

- Arrive at HBFS shop at 8:30.
- Put equipment away in good repair.
- Write up report and make map of the area.
- Submit the report.
