

While in Toronto at the Prospectors' Convention I met Mr. Ross who had come over from Detroit. He had refused by mail to deal on the basis of my original offer without further protection on assessment work. I discussed this with Mr. Gray before he left for Tucson and we decided that a modification giving us three months to determine whether or not we wanted to go beyond the first year's work of 720 days would be all right. This gives us until the end of August. Mr. Ross accepted this, but without the undertaking - subject to our examination - to do a year's work there was no deal. I judged it to be worth \$50.00 to tie up the ground.

Actually I do not believe that there is too much to be learned on the ground. On the Ontario Government Map made in 1953 there is shown a large pit and a shaft with 2" to 4" of chalcocite in 2 veins. There is no further description. I am prepared to recommend that we make the \$1,000 payment and undertake to do 720 days work on our present information.


The results from the present development on Copper Corporation (Mamainse Mine) is not yet conclusive. However, had copper been its present price when that property was offered to us I think that I would have recommended that we take it on.





The various items in your letter are of interest and will be taken into consideration before doing any work. My own opinion on the ore occurrences in that immediate area is that the vertical continuity is somewhat limited, as one at least of Coppercorp's bodies petered out at about 400 foot depth. This, of course, does not mean that they all do, nor that possibly others may not improve with depth.

I visited these claims last Wednesday and found a pit about 40 feet in diameter with some 10 feet of water in it. However, some ten feet of wall was visible at each end and there is hardly any trace in either end of the chalcocite vein, which must have contained considerable amounts of high grade as there are still many pieces to be seen on what was the ore dump and where the ore must have been cobbled for shipping.

No other ore exposures were seen, but several diamond drill holes have been drilled both under the pit and away from the pit obviously looking for parallel shoots.

This is not worth doing any work on as what ore the property may contain is probably in small shoots which would not repay for the labour of locating them.

I have written Ross, releasing the claims, as I had promised I would do if we did not intend to do work.

The day before I went to these claims I visited the Coppercorp. It is a very busy place, with a working head-frame (timber) and a sampling plant going up. I saw some ore specimens and am inclined to think that the ore is very spotty in character and of a type which will probably be difficult to follow.

I got into your property last Wednesday, but went on from there to look at a property up beyond the end of the road and so did not get a chance to write you. There is no telephone communication up there to the outside.

I am sorry to say that I do not consider that the property has good enough chances to warrant doing the large amount of work that would be necessary to locate other ore deposits. It certainly appears to me as though the former operators had taken out all the ore in that particular pit and that they had also done quite a little in looking for continuation of the ore shoot and also had done a considerable amount of general prospecting. There is no doubt in my mind that the shoot they mined was rich for they left quite a lot of ore behind them on the ore dump. 
