

SUPPLIED TAXABLE AND CALE

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This report is supplementary to a report entitled "Geological Report on the Wilkinson Lake Property of New Metalore Mining Company Ltd. in Elmhirst Township, Ontario" by George W. Chilian, Sept., 1974.

On October 11, 1977, a large crawler, excavator (Draught 50) was floated to the property and over 2,000 cubic yards of overburden was removed to expose the easterly extension of the large mineralized quartz vein.

Part of the excavation was below the water table and a water pump was brought in on October 14th, immediately upon completion of the stripping, and five pits were drilled (three with two rounds) and blasted into.

This work verified the easterly extension for approximately 60 feet of wide quartz vein, well mineralized with pyrite, galena, sphalerite and chalcopyrite, in that order of abundance, carrying good gold and silver values. The vein appears to break up and terminate beyond that point, and excavations also to the north and south failed to pick up any off-set extensions.

The total length now exposed on surface is approximately 130 feet and still open to the west, where the elevation drops abruptly into a cedar swamp, prohibiting further follow-up on surface in that direction.

Previous shallow drilling by Mining Corporation in 1936 indicated that a greater length and width was intersected than what has now been exposed on surface, and exploratory drilling to at least 300 foot horizon, with large size core (AXT) should be undertaken to further assess the economic potential of the vein.

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
