# **Prospecting Report on Bennett Lake Property**

This report covers prospecting work carried out during two trips in the fall of 2002 and one trip in September of 2003.

The Bennett Lake property was originally staked in the fall of 1987. It encompassed the Independence Mine to the east and the Red Cedar Occurrence in the south central area. These two occurrences are covered in detail in the Geology of the Calm Lake Area, O. G. R. 226 and the geological map 2467.

The claims are located north of Bennett Lake in the Kenora Mining Division. Access for the two trips in the fall of 2002 was by way of a skidder trail from a point about ¾ of a mile south of the west end of Macpherson Lake. At one point in time it was possible to access the claims by quadrunner but heavy rainfalls have deteriorated the road and washed out the bridge over Bennett Creek. The result is a walk of over two miles to access the main claims.

A total of five days were spent prospecting.

## September 8, 2002

Cec Cranton and myself spent one day prospecting in the area between the Lynx trench and the west side of the claim 1011228. Three old trenches were discovered and they were sampled. The rock is an intermediate volcanic, well silicified and contains about 3 percent pyrite. Some shearing is evident in the trenches. Although it is relatively close to the Lynx trench of 1984, its appearance is quite different. The rock from the Lynx trench contains more disseminated sulfides and more silicification.

# October 12, 2002

I spent one day investigating the area to the south and west of the trenches that Cec and I had located earlier. The rock outcrops encountered were mainly mafic volcanics with no mineralization. I used a beep mat on this trip but no anomalies were discovered. No additional samples were taken.


### August 31, 2003


Kim Davis and myself accessed the property by way of a new logging road (under construction) from the west. The number three post for claim K989656 was located at GPS coordinates 552695E, 5403168N. We proceeded north into claim 1011232. The area is mainly covered with dense under brush and drift. The outcrops that were located were a dark rock with little or no silicification or sulphides. This area is mapped as quartz biotite schist arkose by Royal Crest Resources. No rock of any significance was discovered and no samples were taken.

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## **BENNETT LAKE MAP NOTES**

The three maps include the maps of the two areas prospected in the fall of 2002 and August 2003 and a map of the entire claim block.

The grid shown on the maps is the original grid cut by Royal Crest in 1988. Most of the area shown was recut by Minescape in 1997. I have chosen to use the same grid to simplify comparison of previous results. Claim post locations shown correspond to locations given by Royal Crest.

Most of the claim block is covered with relatively dense underbrush, in particular the west area. Most of the useable timber lies in the southern area. There is considerable blowdown throughout the claim block.

The area between the two beaver ponds located between lines L-15 and L-19 is a low grassy area. The southwest corner of claim K989656 is another low area with a small creek and beaver pond. Since the work was performed by Minescape in 1998 a new beaver pond has been created about just north of the baseline between L-12 and L-13. There is sharp ridge running east-west on the south side of the pond and the ground gradually rises on the north side. Finding a pond here was surprising as I have never seen flowing water in this area in the 16 years since the claims were staked.

The only sample taken for assay was from a trench located on L-20E,  $\sim$ 2+75N. It was a well silicified intermediate volcanic with about 3% pyrite. The assay was 71ppb gold.


