A Successful Spring Launch

Ontario's new online Mining Lands Administration System (MLAS) is now six months old. Our initial launch on April 10 went smoothly and MLAS immediately began to support a high volume of traffic and processed a substantial number of mining claim registrations as well as other transactions with no service interruption or down time due to technical difficulties.

Did you know that, between April 10 and September 1st of this year:

- 33,439 legacy claims converted to 360,706 cell claims and boundary claims;
- 29,156 new cell claims or multi cell claims were registered;
- 1,990 individuals or corporations registered with MLAS (648 are new clients);
- 60 assessment work reports were submitted and 884 distributions of approved credits were processed;
- 670 transactions to transfer mining claims were processed (note this does not reflect the total number of claims transferred).

We are keenly aware of several technical issues that have come up as clients work within the system. We are making every effort to address these problems as quickly as possible and appreciate your continued patience and support. We remain committed to delivering to our clients an online platform for mining lands administration that is among the best in the world.

Technical Standards for Reporting Assessment Work Now Online

This document, <u>available here</u>, sets out what must be included in the technical report applicable to the type of assessment work that is required as part of an assessment work report submission. The technical report for each type of work includes a detailed explanation of the geoscience work done, maps or plans, where required and details of the expenses claimed for the work, together with supporting receipts, invoices and other documents for those expenses.
